In 2012 three of our Year 11 students participated in the Primary Industries Centre for Science Education (PISCE) program in which they were provided with an opportunity to develop skills, knowledge and expertise in areas of interest developed through their science courses. Also at this meeting Dr Lynne Vey, one of our English teachers gave a presentation on using technology to support gifted and talented programs within Cootamundra High and across local schools. Dr Vey outlined how she uses technology and 'Moodle' to provide quality but challenging educational activities.

Technology is used extensively throughout Cootamundra High with the vast majority of classrooms containing interactive whiteboards. The school's new 'Moodle server' and associated programs are being developed. Last week our Year 11 students used our 'Moodle server' to complete the compulsory BOS program "All my own work" online.

A number of Year 11 students recently joined other Regional schools and completed a two day visit to Wollongong University. This visit allowed students to develop a greater appreciation and knowledge of the workings and opportunities available from Wollongong University. Many thanks to Mrs Alderman for the organisation of this excursion.

PICSE Report

All we knew before heading to Yanco for a week was that PICSE was short for Primary Industries Centre for Science Education. Jon Martin, Will Barrett and I (Karney Chester) arrived at the Department of Primary industries unaware and some of us unprepared. The week ahead was awesome and full of adventures.

Some real highlights of the week were going over the entire rice industry starting from an organic rice farm moving right onto the Sun Rice processing plant and then onto the Freedom Foods factory where rice is value added and we followed some products right through the production process.

From there we moved onto Wagga where we had a great tour of the Charles Sturt University and got an insight to some parts and courses offered at the University. That summed up our week spent on camp with other students from Barham, Deniliquin, Wagga, Griffith, and even a travelling student from Adelaide.

From there I was lucky enough to be selected to go to Western Australia where I had another week of science based education at Curtin University. It was a great week and seeing Perth and all of the science that exists in the heart of a city was the experience of a lifetime.

After our week spent experiencing science based fields we were all given the opportunity of a week's work experience with professionals in a primary industries sector that interested us.

Jon Martin went to CSU for his week working with post graduate students carrying an experiment that was testing indicators for anti-oxidants. Will Barrett chose to go to the Narrandera Fisheries where he helped to harvest 60,000 Murray cod fingerlings. I went to the Department of Primary Industries Research Station in Cowra where I got to help with a sheep feeding experiment where sheep were going to be fed algae to see the effects of the algae on Omega 3's in the sheep.

The whole PICSE experience was incredible and well worth our time, if ever the opportunity came up for more students it's definitely worth getting involved.

Dear Parents,

The final years of High School for many students are a challenge. Some rise to them, many just cope and some are completely overwhelmed. We aim to provide the students with skills they can use to face these challenges with confidence.

Learn4Life offers a half day Seminar for students who wish to learn how to revise more effectively. We visit schools and present interactive workshops that encourage the student to become independent learners.

The student will be introduced to Note Taking as a tool to help understanding and recall. These skills will enable the student to prepare their notes for revision. The strategy has been proved as a very effective way of recording notes to enable both understanding and memory.

The Revision Workshop shows students how to maximise their ability to recall without the need to cram. This provides students with confidence in their learning and removes the stress and frustration associated with their current method of revision. The students will also consider their organisational skills and how they might need to improve them.

We will also cover Stress Management in a practical workshop that allows students to understand stress and how to manage it effectively. They will be given ideas of how to relax which will lead to greater concentration and improved memory.

We will ensure their time spent with us is both informative and fun.

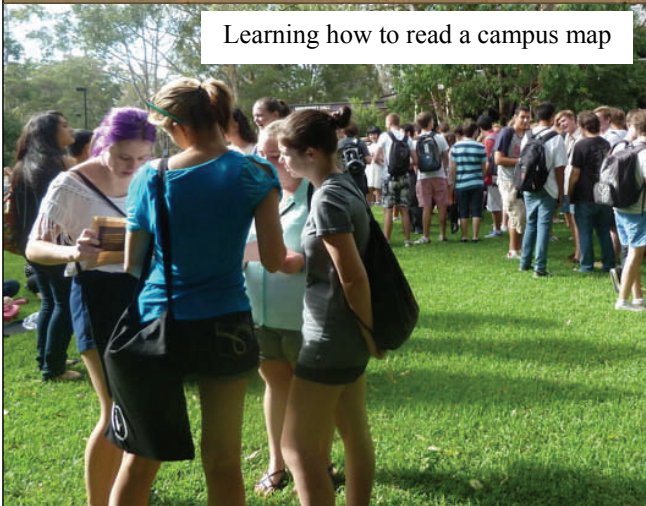

Indigenous Winter School 2013

INFORMATION ABOUT WINTER SCHOOL

The UNSW Winter School is a fully supervised, week-long residential program designed to provide Indigenous students in years 10, 11 and 12 with an opportunity to experience university life. The program is coordinated by Nura Gili and is sponsored by UBS who generously cover the costs for all participants.

During Winter School, 150 students are introduced to tertiary studies in an area of their choice whilst also participating in university life with fellow Indigenous students from around the country. The Winter School aims to assist students in identifying their paths of interest, in turn clarifying the subject areas required for further study in that field. The one-week program will combine expertise from the faculty, university and industry for an all-round comprehensive and unique experience. The program also aims to nurture the leadership, growth and development of all participants with a comprehensive, fun and engaging program of activities. Subject areas offered for the 2013 camp are: Built Environment (including Architecture, Construction), Business, Education, Engineering, Indigenous Studies, Law, Medicine, Performing Arts, Science, Social Work and Visual Arts.

Who can apply?

Any Australian Indigenous student who is in year 10, 11 or 12 and who is aspiring to attend University is eligible to apply for Winter School.

Cost

The program runs at no cost to the student. Nura Gili arranges all travel for students outside the Greater Sydney area and accommodation is in colleges on campus for the duration of the program.

Dates and location

The 2013 Winter School will be held from **Sunday 7th July to Saturday 13th July 2013** inclusive. The program is held on the University of New South Wales (UNSW) Kensington Campus in Sydney and is coordinated by Nura Gili, the University's Indigenous Programs Centre.

What's involved?

The program runs for seven days and six nights and involves an extensive timetable which includes three full faculty days in the specific subject area, as well as academic sessions, cultural activities, excursions and night activities.

The days are completely full and as such, students are expected to be up at 6.30am and back in their rooms with lights out, at 10pm each day. Students over the age of 18 must comply with the rules set down for all other students who are not yet 18.

Whilst Nura Gili acknowledges the legal age of such students, for the purpose of the program, there can only be one set of rules for everyone, as Nura Gili staff must maintain a consistent duty of care to

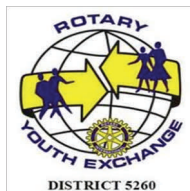

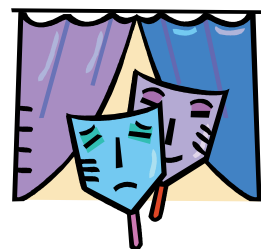
