# **YEAR 11 KOSCIUSZKO EXCURSION**

On Wednesday, 3 December the senior Geography class, accompanied by Miss Dunn and Mr Black, embarked on a three-day excursion to explore the alpine ecosystems of Mount Kosciuszko.



Our first area of study involved a visit to the Yarrangobilly Caves where our fieldwork commenced by looking at the differences in the entrance, twilight and dark ecosystems of the caves. Through a tour of the caves we also learnt about the different cave formations such as the stalactites and stalagmites as well as learning about how the caves are managed.





On Thursday we commenced our 13km walk to the summit of Mount Kosciuszko. Along the way we stopped to complete fieldwork, guided by Mr Black who provided us with extensive knowledge about the alpine ecosystem. We also learnt about the different alpine herbfield communities and how humans impacted upon them.

Friday was the final day of the excursion and we focused on the management strategies which are used within Kosciuszko National Park to manage the large number of tourists that visit the park every year. In particular, we went and looked at strategies used by the ski resorts, which included visiting Perisher and Charlotte Pass.



The Kosciuszko excursion was part of our HSC unit on ecosystems at risk, and it was a great experience to be able to learn about alpine environments by exploring it first-hand. The excursion was great fun and will definitely help us in the rest of the Geography course.


#### **WORK EXPERIENCE**


#### **CLOTHING POOL**
