YEAR 6 TO 7 TRANSITION DAY, 1 NOVEMBER

Year 6 students from 6 local schools had the opportunity to experience being a high school student for a day. All students had the opportunity to sample classes that they will be participating in next year. Classes ranged from English through to Science. The day was the first of 2 for the students. The next day is on the 29th November. Students will need to be at the High School at 9am to start school on time. Students will not need to bring lunch as it will be supplied and they will need to ensure they bring a hat and are prepared to participate in physical activity.

PSC LEADING WITH ACTION DAY 3RD NOV

Eleven students had the opportunity to travel to Young and participate in the Premier's Sporting Challenge Leading with Action Day. The day is designed to provide students with the knowledge and skills in a range of sports so they are then able to help others develop their skills.



Students participated in sports and activities ranging from dance through to softball. The students were also able to meet and interact with students from other schools in the region. The day was a great success with all students gaining knowledge and leadership skills that they will be able to use in everyday activities.

SCHOOL BUS TRAVEL

If your child is entering primary school at year 3 or high school at year 7 next year, you will need to do an update application for free school travel before 30 November 2016.

If you were granted an exemption from the mini-

mum distance criteria because of special circumstances (e.g. a medical condition) you will also need to do an update application.

Importantly, the minimum distance criteria for free school travel change when a student enters primary school at year 3 or high school at year 7, as shown in the table below:

SCHOOL YEAR BAND	MINIMUM DISTANCE FROM HOME TO SCHOOL
Infant students (Kindergarten - Year 2)	No minimum distance
Primary students (Years 3-6)	More than 1.6 km (straight line distance) or at least 2.3 km walking distance
Secondary stu- dents (Years 7-12)	More than 2.0 km (straight line distance) or at least 2.9 km walking distance

This means that when you re-apply you may be living too close to the school to meet the eligibility criteria for the new school year band. If this is the case, even though you may not be eligible for free travel, you may still be able to purchase a school term bus pass for a bus operator in the Opal network at a reduced price for the whole of the school term.

In rural and regional areas, please contact your local bus operator to check if a term bus pass is available. If the student has already been approved for school travel and their address, school or name changes, their details must be updated by the Parent/ Guardian online at the Transport NSW website. Also, ALL students entering Kindergarten, Year 3 or Year 7 in 2017 MUST have their details updated at the Transport NSW website.

Once parents have completed the online application form, they are to print it out, sign and date the form, then return it to the students enrolled school for endorsement.


WHATS HAPPENING AT THE ATS CENTRE

If you have an hour to spare every 6 weeks (or as often as you like), would like to meet new people or find new and interesting ways to use your existing skills, get in touch with our local service.


As our older volunteers retire we need to maintain our current numbers to ensure we can continue to deliver the service 7 days per week to those most at need within our community.


