The course has been run by David Lee who is the




District Officer of the Southwest Slopes Zone, assisted by ex-student Peter Doyle and current Year 10 student Adam Palmer.

STOP WORK MEETING

On Thursday December 8th, the NSW Teachers Federation has called a stop work meeting to discuss and vote on the proposed Crown Employees (Teachers in schools and Related Employees) Salaries and Conditions Award 2016.

The stop work meeting will begin at 8.30am, with all staff expected to return to duty by 10.30 am.

At Cootamundra High a number of teachers will be participating in the stop work meeting, therefore only "minimal supervision" will be provided for students in attendance from 8.30 to 10.30am.

Normal school process will begin at 10.30 am with roll call, followed by the usual recess. Normal classes will begin after recess.

SCHOOL BUS TRAVEL

If your child is entering primary school at year 3 or high school at year 7 next year, you will need to do an update application for free school travel before 30 November 2016.

If you were granted an exemption from the minimum distance criteria because of special circumstances (e.g. a medical condition) you will also need to do an update application.

Importantly, the minimum distance criteria for free school travel change when a student enters primary school at year 3 or high school at year 7, as shown in the table below:

This means that when you re-apply you may be living too close to the school to meet the eligibility criteria for the new school year band. If this is the case, even though you may not be eligible for free travel, you may still be able to purchase a school term bus pass for a bus operator in the Opal network at a reduced price for the whole of the school term.

In rural and regional areas, please contact your local bus operator to check if a term bus pass is available. If the student has already been approved for school travel and their address, school or name changes, their details must be updated by the Parent/ Guardian online at the Transport NSW website. Also, ALL students entering Kindergarten, Year 3 or Year 7 in 2017 MUST have their details updated at the Transport NSW website.


Once parents have completed the online application form, they are to print it out, sign and date the form, then return it to the students enrolled school for endorsement.




JANUARY WORKSHOPS

Volunteering is a way to give something back to the community or a chance to make a positive difference to the lives of the people around you.


If you have an hour to spare every 6 weeks (or as often as you like), would like to meet new people or find new and interesting ways to use your existing skills, get in touch with our local service.

As our older volunteers retire we need to maintain our current numbers to ensure we can continue to deliver the service 7 days per week to those most at need within our community.


