PREMIERS ANZAC AMBASSADORS PROGRAM

My name is Oliver Litchfield and I have been chosen as the 2017 Anzac Ambassador to Greece and Israel

for the 1917-2017 Centenary of Anzac commemorations. The tour will involve six NSW high school students touring the historic battlefields and sites from 100 years ago or 1000 years in the past. The idea of the program is to offer an opportunity for students to



learn more about the men and women of Australia who made the ultimate sacrifice during the Great War of 1914-1918, and paid the ultimate price.

The program is funded and organised by the NSW State Government and Clubs NSW who have organised previous tours into the Battlefields of the western front. Mr Anthony Ball, CEO of Clubs NSW and the Hon David Elliot, minister for Veterans Affairs.

Entering the program required me to write a 2000 word essay answering the following question; "How is the Centenary of Anzac important to modern Australia, and what lessons can be learned from the Battle of Beersheba 1917?"

The tour begins on the 24th of October and the tours first destination is to visit key sites in Greece, where we visit the city of Athens and meet the Greek delegation. We will take this opportunity to see the ancient Athenian Acropolis and the city. A major part of this tour is the visit to the Isle of Lemnos to visit the Anzac Hospitals to see where the brave doctors and nurses treated the wounded soldiers from the Gallipoli Campaign. The tour also visits the Isle of Crete, the Palace of Knossos and Corinth.

Then the Israeli part of the tour begins on the 31th, which starts in Tel Aviv and takes part in the 100 year commemoration of the Battle of Beersheba and a re-enactment of the last Australian Light Horse Charge in history. From there we visit the many of Israel's historic and cultural sites, such as Jerusalem, the Dead Sea and its natural nature reserves.

The Tour returns to Australia on November 5th and from there we will put all our experiences into giving back to the community and share what we have learned, in National events such as Remembrance Day and Anzac Day. I would like to thank the local Cootamundra Council, RSL club and High School P&C for sponsoring my trip and providing support in preparing for it. I wish to return this help by representing my school, town, state and country while overseas, and do it to the best of my abilities.




